

	AE provided an update on Quarter 4, 2016, on transport across the region. <b>Rail</b>	Infrastructure Report (
	The Wales & Borders Franchise is moving forward. It was noted that a two day event had been arranged in Welshpool to allow for bidders to explain their offer. This should feed into the criteria for the franchise on which Welsh Government are expected to consult on in March 2017. As part of this franchise, there will be a new trains but not for the whole franchise area. It was noted that work is taking place with Network Rail to discuss other solutions to rolling stock in this region.	
	The improvements (which include better access) at Machynlleth Railway Station are now completed, but AE stated that news is still awaited on the extension of the car park there.	
	WG have applied for £6.8m to the UK Government through the NSF2 for a new station at Bow Street which includes a new train platform and interchange, car parking and bus stops, as well as a new roundabout on the A487 Trunk Road. AE noted that they hope to hear the financial decision from the DFT by the end of March 2017. Cross Border Links	
	GMW officers group continue to work with Marches LEP on the transport agenda.	
	MS noted that following confirmation to bring the work of TraCC in line with the Partnership, the action has been completed and more meetings will take place with Gwynedd to discuss that.
