5. Regional update to include the regional economic programme and related developments

Gavin Crouch (GC), Special Advisor Business & Analytics, stated that the Strategic Priorities for the region have now been finalised and will be circulated following today's meeting.

The vision for the Growth Deal is being worked on and a single programme of a small number of themes/areas is being developed which is being led by the private sector.

GC provided feedback on the workshops that have taken place to date which are helping to form the vision for the Growth Deal. Workshops have been well attended and good engagement has taken place.

GC stated that he would like to see more representatives from the manufacturing and agriculture sectors attending future workshops.

Based on feedback, GC hopes to have a draft vision in place by the end of next week.

6. Regional Engagement Update Report – Quarter 1 Update



The Chair referred to the attached pre-circulated Regional Engagement Update Report which provides an update on work undertaken during Quarter 1.

The Partnership agreed to the recommendations contained on Page 3 as follows:-

- To endorse the submission, previously agreed by written procedure, to the NAfW EIS Committee inquiry into regional skills partnerships
- 2. For RET officers to arrange a regional meeting with Welsh Government and relevant officers and stakeholders to discuss proposed Superfast Broadband activity, and map properties that will not be serviced after the end of the new programme. This information can then be used to inform activity under the new regional economic programme.
- **3.** To note the position in respect of the update on the Employability Plan and the roll out of Working Wales on 1st May 2019.
- **4.** To note the information on regional exposure to Brexit published by the WLGA.

TRI Programme

Two of the indicative regional list of projects have failed to progress and two are now approved. The successful projects are the Regional Property Development Investment Fund with TRIp funding of £1.5m for two years and Canolfan Dulais, Lampeter (TRIp funding £1.533m). Burgess House, UWTSD and Ladywell House have failed to progress.

The outcome of these changes is that approximately £700k has been lost from the first year's allocation of the programme and, because of the commitment of resources in each of the following years, there is some pressure now in these years which will need careful management.

WG Homes and Places, are asking for certainty on deliverability and likely actual spends on the remaining indicative projects within the available indicative budget allocation for the region over the remaining two years of the Programme by this coming June. They are anxious to avoid underspend and loss of resource for the region
