Noted that support was received to pursue with the GMW Partnership Meeting and regional concerns discussed.</p> <p><b><u>Julie James AM, Minister for Skills and Science: meeting 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2017</u></b> Update was provided on the above meeting where the importance of skills/ broadband for the region was discussed as well as science policy issues affecting the region and skills challenges here.</p> <p><b><u>Guto Bebb MP / OFCOM, Mobile Coverage Summit, 12<sup>th</sup> January 2017</u></b> Noted that Ceri Stephens, Mid Wales Manufacturing Group represented the Growing Mid Wales Partnership at the meeting. Discussions took place re telephone signal at public buildings and improving access to signal across the region and in Wales. 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	<p>The Chair reported on this meeting and noted that the message was emphasised at the meeting that the region cannot function and develop without all networks in place and Wales needs roaming opportunities, and to look at moving on from 4G to 5G coverage.</p>	
<p><b>5.</b></p>	<p><b>Presentation by Welsh Government: Aligning the Apprenticeship Model to the needs of the Welsh economy - Apprenticeship Levy</b></p> <p>Presentation was received from John Jones, Welsh Government re the Apprenticeship Levy (a copy of which is attached). The presentation focused on:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Details of the Apprenticeship Policy</li> <li>• Delivery Priorities</li> <li>• Actions going forward</li> <li>• Details re the Apprenticeship Levy</li> <li>• Details re the Flexible Skills Programme</li> <li>• New Employability Programme</li> </ul> <p>Detailed discussion ensued and opportunity for questions followed.</p> <p>CM asked whether the Flexible Skills Programme, working with clusters of SMEs, could be available in Mid Wales, and then would there be scope to open up to sector clusters across a wider geographical area? It was agreed for JJ and CM to have further discussion outside of the meeting.</p> <p><b>Action: JJ &amp; CM to discuss further.</b></p> <p>It was also agreed that it is important to look at Local Authorities Workforce Development Plans and how apprenticeships are being used throughout the workforce to upskill employees and retain jobs and young people within authorities.</p> <p>The Chair thanked JJ for his presentation today.</p>	 <p>GMWP Skills Programmes Update.1</p>
<p><b>6.</b></p>	<p><b>Regional Learning and Skills Partnership: Update:</b></p> <p>Jane Lewis (JL) provided an update on the Regional Learning &amp; Skills Partnership. JL noted that they are in the process of writing the next draft plan to the Welsh Government. JL noted that they were tasked by the Welsh Government to obtain more industry engagement to inform the plan &amp; recommendations contained therein. JL stated that they have consulted over the last 2 months with sector cluster groups across the region and over 100 businesses which have provided a lot</p>	

	<p>of information. Information has also been included regarding the Welsh Language Act and how the Future Generations Act is influencing development within sectors.</p> <p>JL noted that the plan has to be submitted to the Welsh Government by the 28th July 2017 and would seek the GMW Partnership's approval prior to that. The Plan will also be placed with the Regional Board on the 11th May 2017.</p> <p>Concern was raised that the deadline to Welsh Government was also the date of the next GMW Partnership meeting and therefore there would not be sufficient time for the Partnership to consider the Plan. Because of the difficulties in rearranging the date of the next Partnership meeting, it was agreed that the Plan documents be circulated to and comments invited from all Partnership members be email, discussed at a Cross Sector Working Group and a draft response circulated by email for discussion prior to the RLSP Board meeting on 20<sup>th</sup> July.</p> <p><b>Action: Secretariat to re-arrange the circulation of the documents to enable comments to be submitted to the RLSP.</b></p> <p>The Partnership also agreed to nominate Mike Shaw to continue as the Growing Mid Wales representative on the Regional Learning and Skills Partnership Board.</p> <p><b>Action: MS to continue to represent the GMW Partnership on the Regional Learning and Skills Partnership Board.</b></p> <p>JL stated that the draft Regional Employment &amp; Skills Plan South West &amp; Mid Wales &amp; Employer Engagement Update would be circulated to all following the Partnership meeting today.</p> <p><b>Action: Secretariat to circulate the draft Regional Employment &amp; Skills Plan South West &amp; Mid Wales &amp; Employer Engagement Update to all.</b></p>

<p>8.</p>	<p><b>National Development Framework, To confirm response agreed by email</b></p> <p>Reference was made to the attached report which notes the GMW Partnership response to Welsh Government's call for evidence projects for a new National Development Framework (NDF) for Wales.</p> <p>It was noted that three cross sector working groups of GMW came together with policy officers from both Ceredigion and Powys County Council and worked together to produce the regional response.</p> <p>Noted that the response was circulated to Partnership members to agree and comment prior to submission to Welsh Government on the 6th March 2017.</p> <p>The Partnership noted and confirmed the response submitted to the Welsh Government.</p> <p>It was noted that the NDF is not likely to be approved until 2020.</p>	 <p>8. <p>9.</p>	<p><b>To consider a response to the WG consultation White Paper "Reforming Local Government: Resilient and Renewed" (due 11<sup>th</sup> April)</b></p> <p>BM presented the attached Report regarding the Welsh Government's consultation on 'Reforming Local Government: Resilient and Renewed' for the Partnership to agree to send a broad response (draft attached) following the letter sent to the Cabinet Secretary for Finance and Local Government, Mark Drakeford AM, on the 19th December 2016, stressing the importance of the GMW Partnership to regional economy in Mid Wales and the importance to continue with the work.</p> <p>BM took the Partnership through the draft response in detail and detailed discussions ensued.</p>	 <p>9. <p><b>10.</b></p>	<p><b>Cross Sector Working Group meetings - Regional Engagement Update Report, Quarter 1 2017</b></p> <p>MS provided a detailed update on Regional Engagement Quarter 1, 2017. Further information can be found in the attached document.</p> <p>MS drew the Partnership’s attention to the final bullet point on the first page regarding SmartCymru. MS noted that part of it supports Welsh Government and part of it can be business led. MS noted that it was important for Mid Wales Manufacturing to be aware as there is an opportunity to work more closely there.</p> <p>It was noted that at the last Partnership (6th January 2017), discussion took place on the open call for research innovation operations, 45 proposals have been submitted; a couple of which are from Welsh Government and a number from the Growing Mid Wales Region.</p> <p>The GMW Partnership agreed to the recommendations contained in MS report as follows:-</p> <p><b>Welsh Government: WWV and EW Operations; Arbed 3</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To ask WEFO and the WG Arbed team to provide greater clarity on the definition of target areas for these operations;</li> <li>• To seek clarification from Welsh Government on acceptable evidence to be used in applications from local authorities, and;</li> <li>• To refer the need for common data to evidence fuel poverty to the Welsh Local Government Association.</li> </ul>	 <p>10. <p><b>11.</b></p>	<p><b>Economic Prioritisation Framework</b></p> <p>MS presented the attached reporting regarding the revision of the Economic Prioritisation Framework (EPF). The EPF is a document that is used by WEFO and sets investment context within the 4 regions of Wales. The 4 regions have been tasked to revise and update the Framework. The Mid Wales framework was last updated in 2016 and will now be revised and updated in readiness for submission by the 29th March 2017.</p> <p>The Partnership noted the progress for completion by March 29 2017 and Members to bring forward suggestions for inclusion in the revision.</p>	 <p>11. Revision of the Economic Prioritisation</p>

<p><b>12.</b></p>	<p><b>Future of Regional Policy in Wales, to note developments</b></p> <p>RH presented the attached Paper to the Partnership. RH noted that Brexit will be triggered on Wednesday 29th March 2017. RH noted that WG have been engaged in dialogue with the UK Government as to what that will mean for Wales. The White Paper is being used to secure Wales's future and within that document, assertion has been made that Wales should continue to benefit a similar greater level of funding. There are competences to the way in which money is deployed here in Wales compared to UK Government level and the paper reflects concerns expressed at Growing Mid Wales meetings. The paper tries to suggest a couple of principles and foundations of what comes next which should be part of a consultation in the next coming months.</p> <p>The paper will be used for discussion at EU Advisory Groups.</p> <p>It was agreed that a seminar to discuss the paper would be useful later during the year.</p>	 <p>12 Grwp Cyngori ar Ewro Dyfodol Polisi RI</p>
<p><b>13.</b></p>	<p><b>A Freight Strategy for Mid Wales</b></p> <p>AE noted that funding had been received from Welsh Government to take forward a Freight Strategy for Mid Wales jointly with the Marches LEP. Consultants will now work with Wales on mapping and networking and on freight needs across the region. Some engagement had already taken place at the Mid Wales Manufacturing Event and a meeting will be held with a number of key businesses across the region arranged by Welsh Government on the 6th April 2017.</p> <p>CS noted that she attended the Cross-Sector Working Group in Cardiff and WG noted that any decision on investment must be evidence based.</p> <p>Cllr Alun Williams noted that he would like to see the desirability of rail freight included in the strategy to see what is possible/ what businesses want and what would prohibit it from happening. AE noted Cllr AW's comment.</p> <p>AE noted that a joint document will be completed in April and presented at the next meeting of the Partnership in July 2017.</p>	 <p>13. It is important to keep the dialogue with Welsh Government and build that into the final response.</p>	 <p>14. Building Our Industrial Strategy R</p>
